## **True or False.**

- 1) Boys, starting at the age of five, should not see women in partial attire.
- 2) Boys under the age of three should not see fully unclad women.
- 3) The neckline of the garment must cover everything that is below the actual neck—whatever is halachically not considered to be part of the neck.
- 4) A mother or a father's duty is to inform their daughter if they notice that her collar does not conceal properly.
- 5) The above obligation does not extend to the husband of a woman whose collar does not cover properly.
- 6) The author, Rabbi Pesach E. Falk, shlita, writes that the second button down a blouse is usually too low in order to leave the top button open.
- 7) A necklace worn as a choker can be relied upon to make an inadequate neckline kosher.
- 8) A garment with a boat-shaped (or oval shaped) opening may not be worn alone or without rectifying the collar area.
- 9) The neckline of sweaters that tend to stretch substantially should be checked often to ensure that the neckline has not stretched in a way that renders the garment unfit to be worn (until properly corrected).
- 10) The opening of a back closure on a garment is allowed when the inner garments are covering the flesh that can normally be seen through the opening.
