- \_\_\_\_ 1. Sleeves should extend to at least three inches (7-8 centimeters) beyond the elbow.
- \_\_\_\_ 2. There is nothing wrong with wearing wide sleeves as long as the sleeves are full length and will not ride up the whole lower arm.
- \_\_\_\_ 3. The elbow does not have the same halachos as the upper section of the arm and does not have to be completely covered.
- \_\_\_\_ 4. It is ossur to appear in public with any part of the upper sections of the arms uncovered, but if it is not done on purpose to attract attention, then it is allowed.
- \_\_\_\_ 5. Just as tefillin is identified by the Torah as a “sign of allegiance” to Hashem, so too, covering the arm in the correct manner is a “sign of allegiance” to Hashem for a women or girl.
- \_\_\_\_ 6. According to most Poskim the forearms need not be covered.
- \_\_\_\_ 7. The Rebbitzin of the Steipler Gaon used to say that covering the lower sections of the arms is a segula for having sons who are real talmidei chachamim.
- \_\_\_\_ 8. If covering the forearm has become the local “minhag” (custom), a woman or girl is not required to do likewise.
