**Answer the puzzle using the five clues below (two clues are for extra credit if answered correctly):**

Which Gadol encouraged his sister to be stringent when dressing her daughters (despite the districts people's remarks at the time)?

**Clue #1** - a) If the minimum age at which a girl is required to be dressed properly is three or six/seven; write Z above 4.  
b) If the minimum age is eleven write L above 2.

**Clue #2** - a) An individual who is stringent and dresses his three year old daughter with long sleeves (while everyone else is lenient) should be encouraged; write H above 2.  
b) If the individual should not be encouraged in such a situation; write C above 8.

**Clue #3** - a) If the stringent opinion when saying a bracha facing a tefach is to close the eyes; write S above 1. b) If the stringent opinion when saying a bracha when facing a tefach is to turn the whole body away; write N above 6.

**Clue #4** -a) If a person must only turn his whole body away when less than a tefach is exposed write F above 4. b) If a person can say a bracha when less than a tefach is exposed by closing the eyes, or if necessary to face slightly away from it; write C above 1.

**Clue #5** - a) If Rabbi Pesach Eliyahu Falk, shlita, writes that it is a hardship for a young girl to be dressed with long sleeves; write M above 1. b) If Rabbi Pesach Eliyahu Falk, shlita, writes that it is not a hardship for a young girl to be dressed with long sleeves; write S above 8.

**What is the halacha? (Write Yes or No)**

1. May a father say a bracha if his daughter, who is under 11 years old, is inadequately dressed? \_\_\_\_\_
2. If a six-year-old girl is tall and is the size of a seven-year-old can she wear short sleeves? \_\_\_\_\_
3. If someone is not particular about saying a "davar shebik'dusha" when facing a three year old girl, who is not fully clothed. May he bring his three-year-old daughter to a shul where the majority of people are stringent in this matter of halacha? \_\_\_\_\_
4. If an individual lives where most families dress their daughters according to the stringent opinion, may he/she dress their child differently? \_\_\_\_\_
5. If a woman is nursing her baby, may her husband say a bracha or "dvar torah" when facing her, if less than a tefach is revealed? \_\_\_\_\_
6. If it is the local minhag to cover the full arm when in public, then, may a woman's husband (at home) say a bracha when looking at her arm that is uncovered just a tefach? \_\_\_\_\_
7. May a husband say a bracha when he is directly facing the uncovered feet of his wife? \_\_\_\_\_
8. If a woman is sitting down and her skirt reveals less than a tefach of flesh above her knees may her husband say a bracha while he is looking at her uncovered knees? \_\_\_\_\_
